People of God, hear this glad news: by God's endless grace your sins are forgiven, and you are free—free from all that holds you back and free to live in the peaceable realm of God. May you be strengthened in God's love, † comforted by Christ's peace, and accompanied with the power of the Holy Spirit. **C: Amen.**

**PRAYER OF THE DAY**

Stir up your power, Lord Christ, and come. With your abundant grace and might, free us from the sin that would obstruct your mercy, that willingly we may bear your redeeming love to all the world, for you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

**FIRST READING: 2 Samuel 7:1-11, 16**

*Instead of David building a house (temple) for God, God promises to establish David's house (dynasty) forever. Centuries later, after the Babylonian exile, no king sat on the throne. Even then, however, the people of Israel remembered this promise and continued to hope for a king, the messiah, God's anointed.*

This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

**PSALM: Saint Luke 1:46b-55**

**R:** *You, Lord, have lifted up the lowly. (Lk. 1:52)*

L: My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord,  
my spirit rejoices in God my Savior,

**C: for you, Lord, have looked with favor on your lowly servant.**

**From this day all generations will call me blessed: R**

L: you, the Almighty, have done great things for me  
and holy is your name.

**C: You have mercy on those who fear you,  
from generation to generation.**

L: You have shown strength with your arm  
and scattered the proud in their conceit,

**C: casting down the mighty from their thrones  
and lifting up the lowly. R**

L: You have filled the hungry with good things  
and sent the rich away empty.

**C: You have come to the aid of your servant Israel,  
to remember the promise of mercy, R**

L: the promise made to our forbears,  
to Abraham and his children forever.

## **SECOND READING: Romans 16:25-27**

*Paul closes his letter to the Romans by praising God because, in the proclamation of the gospel of Jesus Christ, God has revealed the promised, divine plan of salvation for all humanity. Paul proclaims this gospel of Christ in order to bring about the obedience of faith among all nations.*

This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

## **HOLY GOSPEL: Saint Luke 1:26-38**

*In this annunciation, Luke makes clear that God comes with good news for ordinary people from little known places. This king will not be born to royalty in a palace, but to common folk in a stall. Here Luke highlights the role of the Spirit, a special emphasis in this gospel.*

The holy gospel according to St. Luke the first chapter.

**Glory to you, O Lord.**

This is the gospel of the Lord. **C: Praise to you, O Christ.**

## **THE APOSTLES' CREED**
