The past several days leading up to the Holy Triduum, (The three holy days of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday- and The Great Easter Vigil) these liturgies of the Church have helped us to practice living as servants in the world. We heard the story of Christ, who just a few days ago, (on Maundy Thursday) knelt before the feet of his disciples washed them as a servant. We also hear Christ proclaiming that we ought to follow his example to do likewise.

Are we ready to be the servant Church? Are we really interested in serving others? Really? Or are we more interested in what we get out of the church for ourselves? Can we truly embrace a vision of the church in which we are all servants of one another and servants within the larger community? Being one of Christ's disciples' means serving without always asking what's in it for us.

We who receive God's love and forgiveness are empowered to love and forgive others as we have been forgiven, first by Christ himself. We who receive God's love in Jesus Christ are called to <u>love one another</u>. Now this is not a suggestion, it is a command/mandate by Jesus himself right before he left his beloved disciples. You cannot be a follower of the Christ, if you are not in "charity and love with your neighbor" (St. Matthew 22:37-39). For we are called to be servants to each other as Jesus became our servant. Our commitment to his loving service is symbolized in the washing of feet, following the example our Lord gave us on the night before his betrayal, death, and entombment.

Remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples, we eat the broken bread and share the sacred cup of this meal every Maundy Thursday and every Lord's Day. Together we receive Christ's gift of himself and are made one body in the meal we share in his most only name.

However, these times of worship and liturgies are not completely ended or finished until we also live out God's love and forgiveness among others. In what ways do we figuratively kneel before others to wash the dust off their feet after their weary travels? In what ways do we extend the leaves of God's table to all who are hungry, lost, confused, tired, or poor, and who still needs to be invited to this great banquet and feast of Love? It is all of God's children yet to be invited by us.

For we must live these commands (again, not suggestions) if we are to taste and see the goodness of Christ and of his glorious resurrection. For the glories of Easter are much longer than one day or even fifty days. The true glories of Easter are for us to experience and participate in all the days of our earthly life. Now, Lent is over and the Easter feast has begun! Go! And live and act as though the living Christ has changed your life and made you one of his own to do His will for the sake of others who are in great need of Christ's hands and feet reviled through YOU!


