Pastor's Ponderings

Go to Galilee

Picture the scene. It's Friday afternoon, Good Friday, actually. There's eerie darkness where there should be bright sunshine. Suddenly, there's an earthquake. Rocks are split and tombs are busting open. Change of scene. It's now Sunday, and St. Mary Magdalene and "the other St. Mary" went to visit the tomb where their beloved friend and Savior Jesus had been buried or three days. Once again the morning is interrupted with an earthquake. An angel with an appearance "like lightning" rolls away the stone and opens the darkness and cold of the tomb. God's decisive work in Jesus demands all the drama that nature can muster up.

The human participates in this story likewise experience extreme emotions because of the events. The guards' fear incapacitates them, and the women leave the tomb "with fear and great joy". And what is the dramatic message that they run to tell? "He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; for there you will see him." The message of Jesus' followers is not only His Resurrection, but the command to "go to Galilee," where they can see the risen Lord.

At the beginning of Jesus' public ministry he "went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people" (St. Matthew 4:23).




From the president....


