THE LESSON AND FR. LUTHER'S COMMENTARY

²⁹ The next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and declared, "Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! St. John 1: 29.

From this passage, we learn that all people have been plunged into sin by the devil and that only the Lamb can lead us out. Our unbelief isn't Jesus' fault. The guilt is ours. If we don't believe, then we're stuck in our own sins. In short, the Lamb of has carried the sins of the world.

You should believe and confess this all of your life. You may think, "Yes, I know that Jesus carried the sins of Sts. Peter and Paul, and all the other saints. But they were holy people. But who knows if Christ will carry my sins, too? If only I were as good as St. Peter or St. Paul." Can't you hear what St. John is saying? "THIS is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the WHOLE world." You must admit that you too are a part of this world. You were born of a human mother and father—you aren't a cow or a pig! It follows, then, that your sins are paid for, just as the sins of St. Peter and St. Paul are paid for. You are unable to pay for your own sins. They couldn't pay for their own sins either. There are no exceptions.

Therefore, don't listen to your own thoughts. Listen to God's Word. It promises forgiveness of sins to anyone who believes that this Lamb carried the sins of the whole world. Did you hear that? The Lamb didn't miss any of it. He carried all the sins of the world from the beginning of time. Therefore, he carried your sin too, and He offers his grace to you". — The Rev. Dr. Fr. Martin Luther. 1530 A.D.

A Word from the President

The church council met in fellowship hall as a group on 14 Jul 2020. Although we had masks on and sat apart from each other, it was good to get back together. The DE-MD Synod has scheduled Pastor Ryan's installation for 4:00pm on Sunday 13 September. This will be a welcome final step in our pastoral transition. The council also approved purchasing a Tabernacle box to hold our communion elements next to the high altar and replacement of 2 sets of our old paraments. The total cost for these purchases was \$5,591 and was funded from various memorial accounts. We were also able to take advantage of a 25% onetime discount from our custom parament supplier. We will continue with the current worship service format with restrictions through August. Council will continue to review the pandemic situation and government guidelines as it changes. A donation request from the Family Crisis Resource Center in Cumberland was discussed and the council decided to send \$250 to the center. St. Paul's also received a donation request from the Lutheran Disaster Response of the ELCA and the council decided to provide \$500 in support of ELCA Disaster Response relief efforts.

Our joint community Vacation Bible School (VBS) began on Monday, 13 July. The Rocky Railway at-home program has 43 children registered from 10 different congregations. Two Facebook live presentations are presented on Monday and Wednesday of each of the five weeks to share with the children, parents, and grandparents. The program will conclude on Friday, 14 August with puppets and helpers distributing candy to drive-by parents and children. This innovative and well-structured VBS presentation is being received very well by the participants. Our appreciation to Debbie Streicher and others for pushing forward and working with the other congregations to make VBS happen this year despite the social distancing restrictions.

It was also a great pleasure for us to be able to properly farewell Pastor Steve and Tommie at our worship service on Sunday. 26 July. Many thanks to Cindy Read and the fellowship committee for setting up a COVID-19 appropriate reception in Fellowship Hall. Kathleen Ball presented a photo album with highlight pictures and farewell notes from congregational members to the Haptonstahl's as a memory of their time with us.

Please be advised that we are planning to reseal and restripe our parking lot the third week in August. We are doing this to protect and extend the life of our parking lot surface. Therefore, entry to the back of the church may be limited during the week. We were going to do this earlier in the year, but the pandemic restrictions required rescheduling. I hope everyone is able to enjoy all this warmer weather and sunshine, as we continue to deal with this unusual pandemic situation. Be safe and healthy.

The Indigo Girl (historical fiction)

Based on historical documents, including Eliza's letters, the main character, Elizabeth (Eliza) Lucas Pinckney, The Indigo Girl, tells the story of a remarkable young woman who changed agriculture in colonial South Carolina where she produced indigo dye. It became one of the largest exports out of South Carolina, an export that laid the foundation for the incredible wealth of several Southern families who still live on today.

Although largely overlooked by historians, the accomplishments of Eliza Lucas influenced the course of US history. When she passed away in 1793, President George Washington served as a pallbearer at her funeral.
