#### BEARING JESUS TO THE WORLD

"My Soul doth magnify the Lord. And my spirit rejoices in God my Savior." Lk. 1:46.

The month of August is an important mouth within the liturgical calendar of the Church. There are many feast days and dedications to the mother of God in this month. We mostly hear the story of Mary usually around Advent/Christmass time. However, Mary's story is a very vital part of salvation history and once a year is not enough. Blessed Mary's story has traditionally been important to women, throughout the centuries since her life time spent here on earth, highlighting, as it does, the significant role of a woman, a very pregnant woman no less. Most mothers can probably relate to St. Mary's feelings of awe, blessing, and praise, even if their children are merely human and their pregnancies mostly planned and understood.

The Madonna's song, too, is well-loved by disenfranchised people. She sings of a God who is changing the order of the world, who is merciful to the poor, and who lifts up the lowly. How could this NOT give hope to these who are weary for the way things are? But is there an entry point to this mouth of Mary, the virginal mother of God! So, what is the point of August 15<sup>th</sup> (especially) for those of us who aren't mothers, or those who aren't disenfranchised? How can we sing of Mary's song for ourselves?

When visited by the angel Saint Gabriel, Blessed Mary chooses to believe the unbelievable truth that she herself is chosen by God. Her song then praises this magnificent truth of God's holiness, a holiness that expresses itself not in exalting the already exalted or lifting up those who are already powerful, but in caring for the underdog, and doing so through ordinary people lie us.

God, our almighty father, still choosing us, whoever we are, asking if we too will bear God's Son to the world that so desperately needs Him. When we tell the world that Jesus' coming means—how it changes everything—and when we labor to make God's love real and visible, we join with the Blessed Mother of God, Mary, in delivering good news to a world that longs to hear and experience it. When we believe in God's choice, as unlikely as it may seem, we can join our holy mother's declaration that "the Mighty One has done great things for me, and holy is His name." (St. Luke 1: 49).

Father Ryan will have Acolyte and Crucifer training following worship on Sunday, August 14<sup>th</sup>.



Personal discovery in a combination of assessments and teaching where you learn:



#### Discover God's Plan for You

It can be confusing to find your place in daily life and even when you consider where and how you can serve in the ministry of the church, whether in the congregation or the community. 


Vacation Bible School Classes,
