CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS

PR: Blessed be the holy Trinity, † one God,
whose voice is upon the waters,
whose mercy is poured out upon all people,
whose goodness cascades over all creation.

Amen.

Silence for self-reflection and examination.

Let us confess our sin, trusting in the abundant grace of God.

Holy God,

C: you search us and know us.

You are acquainted with all our ways.

**We confess that our hearts are burdened by sin—
our own sins and the broken systems that bind us.**

We turn inward, failing to follow your outward way of love.

We distrust those who are not like us.

**We exploit the earth and its resources
and fail to consider generations to come.**

Forgive us, gracious God,

for all we have done and left undone.

Even before the words are on our tongues,

you know them; receive them in your divine mercy. Amen.

PR: How vast is God's grace!

Through the power and promise of † Christ Jesus,

our sins are washed away and we are claimed as God's own beloved.

Indeed, we are forgiven. In the wake of God's forgiveness,

we are called to be the beloved community living out Christ's justice
and the Spirit's reconciling peace. **C: Amen.**

PRAYER OF THE DAY

PR: Everlasting God, you give strength to the weak and power to the faint. Make us agents of your healing and wholeness, that your good news may be made known to the ends of your creation, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **C: Amen.**

FIRST READING: Isaiah 40:21-31

The Judeans in exile have a good reason to be hopeful: the one who will bring them to freedom is the God who created the world, the God who subdues the rulers of the earth and gives strength to those who are weary.

This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

PSALMODY: Psalm 147:1-11, 20c

R: *The LORD heals the brokenhearted.*

L: Hallelujah! How good it is to sing praises to our God!
How pleasant it is to honor God with praise!

**C: The LORD rebuilds Jerusalem,
and gathers the exiles of Israel.**

L: The LORD heals the brokenhearted
and binds up their wounds.

**C: The LORD counts the number of the stars
and calls them all by their names. R**

L: Great is our LORD and mighty in power;
there is no limit to God's wisdom.

**C: The LORD lifts up the lowly,
but casts the wicked to the ground.**

L: Sing to the LORD with thanksgiving;
make music upon the harp to our God,

**C: who covers the heavens with clouds and prepares
rain for the earth, making grass to grow upon the mountains. R**

L: God provides food for the cattle
and for the young ravens when they cry.

**C: God is not impressed by the might of a horse,
and has no pleasure in the speed of a runner, R**

L: but finds pleasure in those who fear the LORD,
in those who await God's steadfast love. Hallelujah!

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

God entrusted Paul with the responsibility of bringing the gospel to diverse people. Hence the focus of Paul's ministry is not his own rights or privileges as an apostle but the privilege of serving God by freely sharing the good news of Christ with others.

¹⁶If I proclaim the gospel, this gives me no ground for boasting, for an obligation is laid on me, and woe to me if I do not proclaim the gospel! ¹⁷For if I do this of my own will, I have a reward; but if not of my own will, I am entrusted with a commission. ¹⁸What then is my reward? Just this: that in my proclamation I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

¹⁹For though I am free with respect to all, I have made myself a slave to all, so that I might win more of them. ²⁰To the Jews I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews. To those under the law I became as one under the law (though I myself am not under the law) so that I might win those under the law. ²¹To those outside the law I became as one outside the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) so that I might win those outside the law. ²²To the weak I became weak, so that I might win the weak. I have become all things to all people, that I might by all means save some. ²³I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

INTERCESSORY PRAYERS

PR: Guided by Christ made known to the nations, let us offer our prayers for the church, the world, and all people in need.

A brief silence.

L: For the church: for ministries of healing and wholeness, for hospital, hospice, and military chaplains, for those serving in prison ministry, for all who proclaim freedom and release in the name of Christ. Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

For creation: for insects in the grass, clouds on the mountaintops, for cattle and the rainwater they drink, for the humility to take our place among all creatures of the earth. Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

For the nations: for all who lead in cities and towns, states and countries; for community organizers, school officials, and CEOs; for international health organizations, that in times of trial, fear, or hopelessness, they find freedom in service to those most in need. Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

For all wearied by life's burdens: for those who are poor, for those lacking supportive relationships, for those crushed by debt, for those struggling with chronic pain or other sickness, for those exhausted from overwork or stress, and for all who cry out to you (*especially-see prayer list*).

Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

For this congregation: for outreach and social ministries centered here (*especially APPS and Bountiful Blessings*); for parish nurses and visitors; for ministries of companionship and support, for the young people in this place who open us to new understandings. Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

In thanksgiving for the faithful departed, who were called by name and now rest from their labors, that their lives serve as witnesses to the goodness of God. Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

Heavenly Father, keep us vigilant as we follow all cautions to protect our health and well-being. We pray that those who have the virus will be restored to full health. We ask for protection for medical and support workers as they treat those infected. We pray that we will be generous, remembering that we share a common humanity and a responsibility for one another.

Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

Most Gracious Father, we thank you for answered prayers. We thank you for those who continue to diligently work to administer the vaccine for the CoronaVirus which continues to claim so many lives. We pray for the scientists and medical staff who believe the vaccine will be available to all of God's children in the near future. We pray that when distributed, the dispensing will be orderly, the vaccine will be effective and will have no adverse side effects.

Let us pray, **C: have mercy, O God.**

PR: Merciful God, hear the prayers of your people, spoken or silent, for the sake of the one who dwells among us, your Son, Jesus Christ our Savior. **C: Amen.**
