


**St. Paul Lutheran Church

**Forgive us, gracious God,  
for all we have done and left undone.**

**Even before the words are on our tongues,  
you know them;**

**receive them in your divine mercy.**

Through the power and promise of † Christ Jesus,  
our sins are washed away  
and we are claimed as God's own beloved.

Indeed, we are forgiven.

In the wake of God's forgiveness,  
we are called to be the beloved community  
living out Christ's justice  
and the Spirit's reconciling peace.

### **FIRST READING: Acts 9:1-22**

*Three times the book of Acts describes Paul's conversion. This telling, coming between Philip with the Ethiopian and Cornelius's conversion, sets the stage for extending the gospel to the Gentiles.*

This is the Word of the Lord. **C: Thanks be to God.**

### **PSALMODY: Psalm 67**

**R: Let all the peoples praise you, O God.**

L: May God be merciful to us and bless us;  
may the light of God's face shine upon us.

**C: Let your way be known upon earth,  
your saving health among all nations. R**

L: Let the peoples praise you, O God; let all the peoples praise you.

*Here Paul himself tells of the prologue to his becoming the great apostle to the Gentiles. He admits his former blindness, seeing the contrast as an avenue for the greater glory of God.*

**HOLY GOSPEL: Saint Luke 21:10-19**

*The third gospel contains several short apocalyptic passages, which helped to encourage readers who, in the decades after the resurrection, were experiencing persecution for their faith. St. Paul had found himself on both sides of such persecution.*

The holy gospel according to St. Luke the first chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

This is the gospel of the Lord. **C: Praise to you, O Christ.**

**SERMON**

*Silence for reflection.*

**THE APOSTLES' CREED**

**C: I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.**

**I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.**

**On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come to judge the living and the dead.**

**I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic church, the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection + of the body,  
and the life everlasting. Amen.**
