What is the Epiphany?

The 12 days of Christmas is the period in Christian theology that marks the span between the birth of Christ and the coming of the Magi, the three wise men.

The Epiphany season, beginning on January 6th, serves the church year by bridging Christ's incarnation and his passion. It celebrates the revelations of Jesus as the Christ, the Savior of the world, particularly in such events as the miracles.

The number of Sundays within the Epiphany season is determined by the date set for Easter.

The First Sunday after the Epiphany is always celebrated as the Baptism of Our Lord.

The last Sunday after the Epiphany is always celebrated as the Transfiguration of Our Lord.

White is the liturgical color for the festivals of the Epiphany, the Baptism of Our Lord and for the Transfiguration of Our Lord. Green is the color for the second through the eighth Sundays after the Epiphany of Our Lord.

The Holy Communion liturgy for this season includes the Gloria in excelsis, the proper preface for Epiphany and the Nunc dimittis.

The church council met via a Zoom video conference call on December 8. The council reviewed the current community COVID-19 infection rates and determined that the congregation should continue to not have in-person gatherings at the church. The council approved the overall 2021 budget to be presented at our annual congregational meeting on 31 January 2021. The finance committee recommended that we hold the projected income the same as the previous year and maintain fixed expenses such as payroll and insurance the same but reduce other expenses to allow for the overall decreased cash balance resulting from the previous 2020 end-of-year results. We determined that there will be three council position openings that should be filled and approved during our annual congregational meeting.

This year we will hold our annual meeting at 11:30 a.m. via a Zoom video conference call. Please bear with us as we utilize this new method for holding our annual meeting. Given the expected illness infection rates for January, it seems most prudent and wise to use this method at this time. Please mark 11:30 a.m. on Sunday, 31 January 2021 on your calendars for this important meeting. We will not be holding a LOFT Bible study for that day. More information will be forwarded to you this month about how to join us with your digital device or telephone for the meeting.

As we look forward to the new calendar year, new resolutions, and hopefully ending our national COVID-19 pandemic through vaccinations, I hope everyone will be able to enjoy the beginning of a new year and the Epiphany season with family and friends. Our church council will meet next on 12 January 2021.
