There will be several occasions in the upcoming year to recognize this important milestone. The church council completed many items of business at our December meeting. We welcomed the Rev. Steve Haptonstahl as our part-time interim pastor. We are pleased and excited that Pastor Steve was available to serve as our interim pastor until a new pastor is found. Pastor Haptonstahl will preside at the second, fourth, and fifth Sunday worship services. We will continue to have supply pastors for the first and third Sundays. Pastor Haptonstahl will be available for 10 hours or more during the week to conduct church business and serve on pastoral duties. Please welcome him to our congregation and introduce yourself when you see him.

We selected the date for our annual congregation meeting which will be held on Sunday, 27 January 2019 after Loaves and Fishes fellowship. Please mark your calendars now and plan to be with us for this important meeting. We will be presenting a summary of our accomplishments for 2018, our proposed 2019 budget, elect new council members for vacant positions, and discuss other items of congregational business. Our call committee is working on filling in the forms required by the Synod and the ELCA as part of the search process. I am grateful for those who have been serving on council with me this year. With their help and support we have accomplished a great deal during this year of transition.

The council continues to consider improvements to the church security and safety. We have two contract proposals for a card swipe entry—system on the inner doors and a remote video entry system for the school to open the interior doors from the basement. Further discussions are needed to determine whether either system or both are necessary for us. As we look forward to the New Year, have a great beginning and enjoy the Epiphany season.

225th Anniversary: In the Beginning

The year 2019 marks the 225th year that the congregation of St. Paul's Lutheran Church has been worshipping God together in Cumberland, Md. Throughout this year, we will be sharing some elements of our congregation's history in the Spire, as well as preparing for some commemorative celebrations during this year. During this time of transition for St. Paul's, it may be good for us to look at where we have been as we plot our course for where we are going. So we start at the beginning: May 11, 1794, was the date that German settlers organized the congregation. Originally called the Evangelical Lutheran Congregation of Cumberland, Maryland, it was later called Christ's Lutheran Congregation. It wasn't called St. Paul's Lutheran Church until 1895, 100 years into its life.

The original church property, purchased from Thomas Beall of Samuel, was an acre, comprising the entire block ringed by Baltimore, Center, Frederick, and George streets downtown. The first church was a two-story log building, 60-feet by 40-feet, topped by a belfry. It served the congregation for more than 50 years. It is pictured in one of the stained glass windows in the current church.

Along with being the "Mother of Lutheranism" in Western Maryland, this congregation opened its church building in its first 40 years to nurture the growth of many of the other denominations and faiths – including the Methodists, Episcopalians, and Presbyterians. Services were held in German for more than 20 years, and the earliest church documents are written in that language.


