Pastor's Ponderings

Flaming Fire and Breath of Wind, Come Holy Spirit

We can imagine the scene in the upper room: a diverse group of one hundred twenty followers of our Lord, Jesus from the beginning. Others are more recent believers. We can also imagine a wide range of feelings and emotions: from steadfast confidence in the promises of Jesus to uncertainty over the happenings of the last fifty days. But when the Holy Spirit blew its mighty breath of wind into the room on Pentecost like tongues of flaming fire, the gathering was transformed, galvanized into a new community with an urgent message—and with new language to share that message.

The portrayal of the coming of the Holy Spirit the parakeet in the flaming fire and breath of wind makes a fearful image before those followers/disciples and even us today. A fire fanned by wind is uncontrollable, sometimes uncontainable. When Jesus likens the Sprit to the breath of wind he does so to remind us of this freelance power of our God: "the wind blows where it chooses, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know where it comes from or where it is going" (St. John 3:8). And while the flaming fire flames borne by wind create destruction, this fire-like presence of God Brings radical transformation from the first believers fathered in the upper room to present-day-believers. continued on page 2

At Pentecost there is no going back to what once was. There is a saying that once you show people a picture of the earth taken from the moon, there are then certain land-bounded myths (for example, "the world is flat") that simply cannot be sustained. So it is with Pentecost. We are no longer captive to the old myths that tell of a divide humanity of insiders and outsiders, or that speak of God's distance or indifference. We cannot and must not go back for there is no going back now. And why can't we go back? Because Almighty God has changed us from within, and has changed our world from the inside out. That is why we can't. A new dawn has broken into our spiritual reality and we must be ready to except it and clam it as our own.

"When the Holy Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." (St. John 15: 13).

A Prayer for the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit.

O Lord Jesus Christ Who, before ascending into heaven, did promise to send the Holy Spirit to finish your work in the souls of the Apostles and Disciples, design to grant the same Holy Spirit to me that you may perfect in my soul the work of your grace and your love. Grant me the Spirit of Wisdom that I may despise the perishable things of this world and aspire only after the things that are eternal; the Spirit of Understanding to enlighten my mind with the light of your divine truth; the Spirit of Counsel that I may ever choose the sure way of pleasing God and gaining through Christ merit, heaven; the Spirit of Fortitude that I may bear my cross with you and that I may overcome with courage all the obstacles that oppose my salvation the spirit of Knowledge that I may know God and know myself and grow perfect in the knowledge and likeness of the Spirit of your Saints; the Spirit of Piety that I may find the servanthood of God sweet and amiable; the Spirit of Fear that I may be filled with loving reverence towards God and my dread in any way to displease Him. Mark me with the sign of your true disciples and animate me in all things your Spirit. Amen.

Our theme scripture is the parable of the Sower. It's all about "planting seeds" in our homes, congregations, and community. Come and see!


The limit is 40 children and the registration ends very soon! Forms are available in the church office.




We will take a summer break during the months of June, July, and August. We will begin again in September.
