While trees are in their dormant period it is a season for cutting them back or pruning them. Rather than hurting the trees, pruning—when done correctly—can improve the shape, future growth, and fruit-bearing potential of a tree.

Lent can also be a time for pruning that which is misguided in us. Lent can be a time for us to get rid of those things that may be preventing our spiritual growth. We trim things back and get closer to the vital trunk and root system that those things that truly do sustain and nourish us may take root. How do we do this? We rightly begin this season by returning to God's word which nourishes and stains us like nothing else can or will. Since Ash Wednesday, we have begun a familiar 40 day journey in our Christian walk into the holy season of Lent. We began two weeks ago the somber Lenten fast with the imposition of ashes and time of quite prayer and meditation. It is a solemn day when we remember our own mortality, our frailty, our limitations. We are not superhuman. Our bones can be broken as well as our will and sprit.

We do not have as much control over the world as we might think we do. Really, we do not have as much control over our own selves as much as we think we do. How many New Year resolutions, diets, and personal declarations have we seen change from rock solid conviction to forgotten and distant memories.

This most holy season of Lent gives us the difficult opportunity to recognize that the salvation of the world....even the salvation of myself....will not come from me.

Keeping a holy Lenten season is a humbling season indeed. Lent helps us focus, a little more each day, on the one from whom my salvation and the salvation of the world does come-Jesus the Christ.

Ash Wednesday we were marked with a cross of ashes as a stark reminder that we are nothing more (physically) then dust of the earth. And to realize and hear this reality is very hard to swallow. However, it is the sobering reality of truth. We are dust and to dust we will return. But we are also beloved children of God and the redemption of the cross reaches even to little dust balls such as us. Also remembering, even in our most dormant seasons in this life, our heavenly Father is making us ready to achieve our fullest possible growth potential.

Sunday, March 7, 2021

Circumstances of the pandemic made it advisable to suspend in-person worship for a while. The Worship and Music Committee met via Zoom on February 24, 2021, and unanimously agreed that we could safely resume in-person worship on March 7, 2021.

As before, we will follow the Ministry Plan Guidelines shown below. Masks are mandatory, they must cover both nose and mouth while inside the building

<u>Please do not talk or visit with each other</u> while inside the building <u>Please be diligent about following these two guidelines</u>.

During worship:

Physical distancing, pews are marked for seating

Music, instrumental only, please refrain from singing

Peace, remain in place with a nod, wave, "peace sign"

<u>Holy Eucharist</u> Pre-packaged communion kits will be used. Ushers will distribute the kits and will return to pick up the used kits.

To minimize physical contact: there will be no bulletins, the **entire liturgy will be on the screens**; **offering plates** will be available at both entrances;

<u>Taking Faith Home</u> will take place prior to the Benediction; there will be no <u>Loaves and Fishes Fellowship</u> after church.

The cost of each basket is \$75.00.


Taking Faith Home During Lent A Lenten Focus on the Bible and Devotions


