## Pastor's Ponderings

#### FOLLOWING THE WAY OF CHRIST OUR REDEEMER

In a month's time we will be waving and sing songs of triumph and praise that sound very joyous. We will bless the Lord and proclaim there to be peace and glory. And then we will take a deep breath. This is the day that comes before all days—the day that begins our journey, not to the empty tomb, but to the cross of Holy Week.

For in about a month's time we will be celebrating/observing, Passion/Palm Sunday. We get excited about Jesus riding into town and being exalted until we think about the next time he will travel and we will gather. It's hard not to look ahead; it's difficult to remain in the moment.

### From the president.....






### Easter Sunday floral baskets
