"You will know the truth, and the truth will make you free" (St. John 8: 32).

It is a human thing to be tempted into name-dropping. If there is a way to elevate our status in the eyes of another, we will often consider doing that. When Jesus mentioned freedom to the religious people in front of him, they recited their pedigree, making sure he knew that they were children of Abraham and had themselves never been slaves to anyone. They might also have said things not unlike, "I grew up going to church," or, "I can recite the Lord's Prayer and the twenty-third psalm by heart!" We might imagine United States citizens responding in a similar way: "Hey, we're free already; this is the land of the free and the home of the brave." Right!?

Maybe the people hearing Jesus thought he was only talking about "religion."

Jesus' response is to clarify that true freedom is an eternal thing beyond intellectual understanding. Looking over his religious audience, we can imagine him hinting that religious people need freedom at least as much as anyone else (and maybe need it more!).

What does it mean to continue in Jesus' words, this place where true freedom emerges? Besides the language that came our of his mouth, consider that Jesus may have been referring to his way of living as the Living Word of God. Our greatest freedom comes not from knowing certain facts about Jesus or intellectually understanding certain theological principles, but from our relationship with Jesus himself. In that case, to continue in Jesus' word means to live faithfully in God's worry-free, no-strings-attached love. To live in freedom would mean to not worry about much else. This is what true freedom looks like and feels like to the attentive and active Christian. Let us follow in the way of our Lord, and be that living light for all to see.




What's in the bag? Resources for prayer, scripture, and more are found in each child's individual bag with different ways to be involved during worship.
