Pastor's Ponderings

FOR OUR TIME AND PLACE



In certain seasons of our lives we may feel like we have lost passion and energy within ourselves, in a significant relationship, in our faith, or even in our involvement with the church. What once had great meaning may now seem empty, dull or pointless.

Though we continue to tell the "old, old story" of Jesus and his love, it is made new in the context of our present-day lives, and as it leads us forward into the future with a renewed faith. Though that usually involves change, many of us would like to remain in the safe and comfortable faith of our former childhood, rather than face the challenges of a mature and questioning faith as we age.

The Reformation, which we commemorate (on Oct. 31st), was a time of great change and upheaval. The Rev. Dr. Fr. Martin Luther and the other reformers made the holy gospel come to life for that time and place in light of God's revelation to Fr. Luther as he translated St. Paul's passage in epistle to the Romans. It taught that the heart of the true gospel is that we are justified by God's grace as a free gift. There is nothing we can do to earn God's favor. Rather, the truth that sets us truly free is that God loves us unconditionally.

Faith Formation Team



November 19th is Harvest Sunday.



We thank you for the donations received so far toward the Air Conditioner Fund. Donations received so far is \$460. We are thankful for the start of the fall season temperatures so that the air conditioners are not needed right now. I know many of us would like to keep the 80-degree days coming but I am happy that the use of the air conditioners is coming to an end. The more the units need to run the more strain we put on the good units that are functioning. As mentioned in the past newsletter, the cost of a new unit is over \$9000 each so we need to work on replacing the non-functioning units as soon as we can. Please prayerfully consider a year end taxdeductible gift if you feel called to go toward the Air Conditioner Fund to help us with this large expenditure.

Grace and Peace to all my brothers and sisters here at St. Paul's. I have been very blessed and humbled to be serving as your Treasurer these past 8 months and have learned a lot about the church and the outreach that we do into our community. 
