"We proclaim Christ Crucified!" 1St Corinthian "Behold the life giving tree of the cross."



Being confronted with death is a disorienting emotion. Our lives can be going along so well, and then all of a sudden we get a phone call that begins with the words, "We regret to inform you" or "Are you sitting down? We all know what's coming next. These are words to do not like or want to ever hear. And in an instant, our tightly woven lives start to unravel right before our very eyes.

As a people who try to avoid death at all costs, celebrating the great Feast of Holy Cross Day must not make a lot of sense to most of the world. The cross, after all, is an instrument used for a very gruesome death. It has become a symbol of the worst kinds of brutality that human beings can inflict on one another. And yet if it's only a symbol, only a kind of logo for Christianity, a trademark for our "product" in the vast expanse of consumer culture, we diminish the real torture it caused its victims—not the least of which is the one our gospel calls the "Son of Man."

How will we as contemporary Christians think about the cross? Will we spend our energy trying to clean the image up-, hiding its shame and brokenness behind a veneer of power and prosperity? Or will we call it what it is and open ourselves to its tragedy?

The reason we observe the Feast of the Holy Cross Day is because God took the latter option. Our gospel says that God loved the world so much in <u>this</u> way: by opening the divine heart to share our common fate. Lifted up on the cross, we see more than a gruesome victim. We see ourselves in the face of the Crucified one more clearly. And because he lives, we too will live with him—our tragedies safe in His triumph. Thanks be to God, who gives us the victory to overcome what would have been our gruesome end.


The Faith Formation Team will meet on Wednesday, September 6 at


